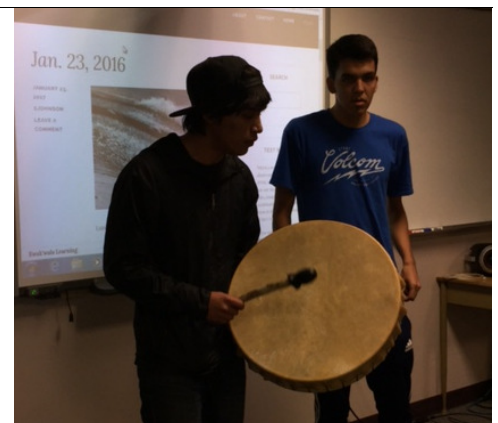
FIND YOUR FIT

SHOULDER TAPPERS

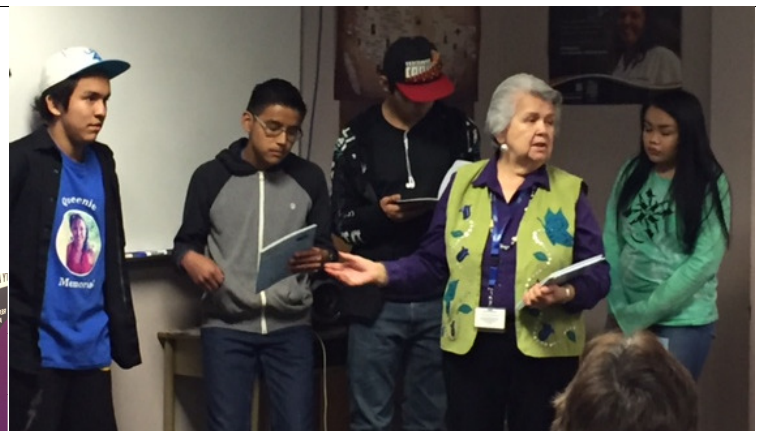
